The extremely cold weather at the start of this week meant that our professional learning day moved on-line, but staff from across the Exe Valley and Moorsway schools were still able to meet to learn about the next steps of our work on task design, writing development, the new Ofsted Toolkit and Early Years communication and language work. The sessions were led by subject leaders and the School Improvement Team. The final professional learning day of the school year will be on Friday, 26th June 2026.

THORVERTON PRESCHOOL

Thorverton preschool joined the EVMF on 1st January 2026 and we are delighted that Deborah Morris and her team are now part of the wider school grouping. Many thanks to Toby Giles and the preschool committee for their hard work and commitment to running the preschool and managing the handover to the federation. The preschool is now governor-led and Debbie Morris will be meeting regularly with senior leaders and governors to ensure that Thorverton Preschool continues to flourish as part of the federation.

SHAUGH PRIOR SCHOOL

Devon County Council is consulting on the future of Shaugh Prior Primary School which includes a proposal to close the school from 31 August 2026. Shaugh Prior is part of the Exe Valley and Moorsway Federation. This consultation is being undertaken in response to falling pupil numbers, educational standards and viability concerns. No decision to close the school has been made. A statutory process is being followed and is a legal requirement.

An information session is being held at The Moorland Hotel, Wotter, Plymouth, PL7 5HP on 29 January 2026 from 3:45pm to 6:45pm with representatives from the Governing Body and Devon County Council. YEAR 5 and 6 RESIDENTIAL

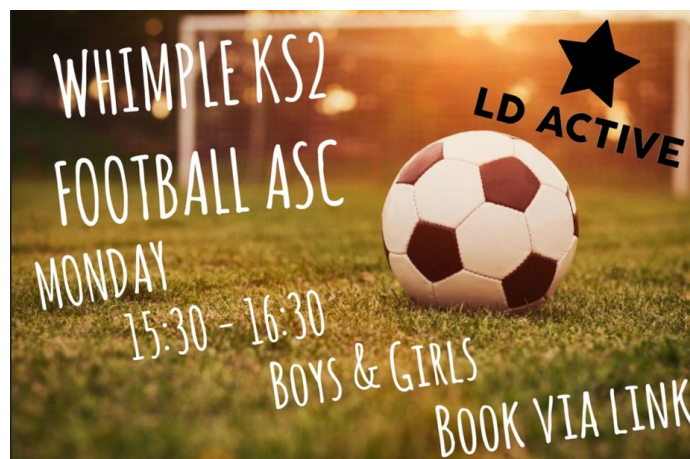
