I am very pleased to say that we have had a good response to the advertisement for vacancies for the Head of School at Brampford Speke and Cornwood. Interviews will take place on Tuesday, 24<sup>th</sup> March in the schools and then on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> March at a central location for governors of both the Exe Valley and Moorsway schools to attend. We will be joined for the second day by a representative of the Diocese of Exeter, as both schools are Church Schools. ### **UNTANGLED PARENTING CONVERSATIONS – INTRODUCTION SESSION**

Parents are navigating more pressure than ever before - school expectations, emotional wellbeing, behaviour, screens and friendships. Lin Courage, who is a life coach, parent and an EVF member of staff, is offering an introductory session to explore how the mind shapes our experience of family life and introduces a simple model called the Think Tank, helping parents understand how thoughts, emotions and actions interact in everyday parenting moments.

Rather than focusing on fixing behaviour, the session looks at the patterns that sit underneath many parenting challenges and how greater awareness can lead to calmer responses and stronger relationships at home.
